Local Policing Information and Guidance



LOCK

- Lock all doors and remove the keys before leaving the house.
- Keep front doors locked even when you are at home and especially if you are in the back garden.
- Close all windows fully before you leave the house, lock downstairs windows and remove the keys.
- Use window limiters to allow air in instead of keeping windows fully open, even when you're at home.
- Install window locks on upstairs windows that can be easily accessed by a flat roof.
- Lock back gates using a sturdy lock such as a closed shackle padlock to no less than CEN 3-4 security grade or 5 lever lock.

LIGHT

- Make your home look lived in use timer switches if you're not home.
- 'Dusk-to-dawn' sensored security lighting is a cheap, low cost way of making sure the front of your home or shed/outbuilding is well-lit.
- Visible burglar alarms can make burglars think twice; get specialist advice and consult your insurance company.
- Hedging and shrubs to the front of your property should be pruned to no higher than 1m and trim trees up from the ground to 2m. This will allow a clear line of sight across your property and will stop the garden being used as a hiding place.

HIDE

- Keep your valuables, jewellery, cash, passport and deeds to your property in a safe.
- Never leave spare keys in an open place. Be aware, burglars know all the usual hiding places so never leave a spare key under the doormat or under a garden gnome.
- Keep dustbins and wheelie-bins away from fencing/gates as these can be used by thieves to climb into windows or used to escape.
- Make sure valuables are property marked. Take photographs and keep a note of any serial numbers.
- Don't leave equipment and tools lying around that can be used by burglars to break into your home, such as hammers, shovels or gardening tools. Keep ladders locked away and out of sight.

Police Volunteers

Anyone interested in becoming a Local Policing Volunteer will undergo a training package, be given a tabard and have a direct point of contact with police, as well as be included in regular meetings. The supportive role is also designed to work alongside usual activities and at no point requires participants to directly get involved

in tackling crime. Volunteers will need to undergo and pass security checks at the appropriate level for the role, although no medical assessment is required. For further information follow link visit

The Most Common Issues Reported to Pinewood Parish Council

Parking

It is not only students at "one" who abuse the parking, persons parking their cars and vans whilst working out of the area is becoming a nuisance to many residents.

Actions Taken To Date

Suffolk Police have recently attended parking issues in Cottingham Road and are to review parking complaints in other areas of Pinewood.

Bobbits Lane

Ongoing issues regarding Anti Social Behaviour on motor bikes and fly tipping.

Actions Taken To Date

Police remain actively monitoring both of the above situations. Recently, notices and new gates have been installed. Six riders were engaged at the end of July by Police and received warnings for using the area with trials bikes. The area was patrolled by Hadleigh, Ipswich and a Police Dog unit. One section 59 notice was issued.

Dog Bins & Rubbish Bins

Dogs are fouling the grass verge on the right hand side of Sprites Lane, (towards Belstead school)

Actions Taken To Date

One new Dog bin already burned out. New bin ordered for the Sprites Lane area.

Dogs Running Off Leads

Recently reports have been received regarding dogs being off their leads in green areas in Pinewood and they are jumping up and frightening both young and aged members of the public.

Actions Taken To Date

Alert residents about this issue.

Taking your dog for a walk? Before you go stop and think about what you need, poo bags, treats and of course, a lead!

Speeding

Speeding still remains an issue in the Pinewood area.

A recent speed check carried out by Suffolk Police showed more than 30 vehicles were stopped in Pinewood in a few hours on one day for ignoring the speed limits, many in the Ellenbrook Road area.

Potholes, Road and Pavement Issues

There have been many reports received about overhanging trees affecting pavements around Pinewood Parish. Overgrown trees and bushes are creating havoc with pedestrians having to walk into the road to bypass the offending problems. Any trees that overhang your property and affect the right of way of pedestrians and vehicles should be maintained and cut back by the owner of the land.

General Data Protection Regulations 2018

Over the last few weeks you have probably read or seen articles in the press or on the television news regarding the new General Data Protection Regulations which is normally abbreviated to GDPR. The GDPR became law on the 25th May 2018 and replaced the Data Protection Act 1998.

One of the main changes is that the new GDPR places a much greater emphasis on transparency, openness and the need for all groups including your parish council who hold personal data to be accountable for it and comply to the new reporting regulations. Failure to comply with the new regulations will result in fines and penalties.

As a general guide personal data relates to any living individual who can be identified from that data alone or in conjunction with other data held. Examples of personal data could be an individuals name, address, post code, photograph, email or telephone number.

Pinewood Parish Council has always kept the minimal amount of personal data on residents and that data has been securely managed and retained only for its intended use. Once data is no longer required for its intended use it is destroyed in an appropriate approved manner.

To enable the parish council to fully conform with the new GDPR the council is revisiting all of its procedures in connection with obtaining, recording, using and destroying personal data. Most of this work will be completed over the coming weeks. Three of the documents that have to be produced are the Privacy Notices relating to personal data, email and website, all these are currently being drafted and will appear on the parish website over the coming weeks.

If any residents have concerns relating to personal data that the parish council may be hold on them please submit their concerns in writing to the parish clerk where they will be resolved.
