Local Policing Information and Issues

Speed Indicator Device

As readers are very aware speeding is causing many roads in Pinewood and Thorrington Park to become dangerous. Traffic calming measures are being used to heighten driver's awareness of the speed at which their their vehicles are travelling. The first placement for the new speed indicator device was put into operation at the end of December. It reacts to speeding vehicles with messages stating "Slow Down" to those travelling above the speed limit and "Thank You" to vehicles that are speed compliant. Please assist us in keeping our parish safe for all pedestrians, cyclists and motorists by safe driving. The device will be moved around two sites in Pinewood and two sites in Thorrington Park where speeding vehicles have been reported by Police and members of the public. This equipment was part funded by our local Suffolk County Councillor, Mr Christopher Hudson.

Suggested Home Security

- <u>Front boundaries</u> should be at least 1m high when possible and when planning requirements allow.
- <u>Rear boundaries</u> should be at least 1.8m high.
- Lock gates with closed shackle padlocks.
- <u>Remove anything that could be used to force</u> entry such as loose bricks and tools.
- Keep your shed and garage secure.
- <u>Always lock</u> your doors, even when you <u>are at</u> <u>home.</u>
- Lift the handle, turn the key and remove it to secure a multipoint locking door.
- On all other doors <u>make sure</u> you have a 5 lever mortice lock BS 3621.
- <u>Use window locks</u> and never leave a window insecure if you leave the room for any period of time.
- Install and use an alarm and CCTV.
- <u>Use lights</u> on timers when your house is unoccupied.
- Register all property at <u>www.immobilise.com</u>.
- Avoid keeping cash at home.
- <u>Don't store</u> your valuable items in places such as dressing tables, bedroom, drawers, under the bed or in the bottom of the wardrobe.

Do you have a PIR security light on your building? If so, do ensure that the PIR unit is in the correct position as it appears that some may have been altered by unknown persons, therefore leaving the light sensors not working correctly.

Vehicle Security

Police are reminding motorists to remove belongings from their vehicles and to ensure they are locked after a number of thefts from vehicles in Ipswich since the beginning of the New Year.

A new year's resolution - Always check your door handles to ensure the locks have engaged. Some of the aforementioned vehicles were left unlocked, whilst others were entered after windows were broken and items left on display were stolen.
