#### A POTENTIAL LIFE SAVER ARRIVES AT PINEWOOD COMMUNITY HALL

Pinewood Parish Council has purchased and is in the process of installing an Automated External Defibrillator (AED). Soon the site will be registered as containing a Community Public Accessible Defibrillator (CPAD) and hopefully this will be available within the next few weeks. The AED is enclosed within a secured wall mounted cabinet on the external wall of the community hall close to the car park entrance to the hall. To prevent theft and vandalism to the AED it is positioned in a prominent location which is well illuminated and the door to the cabinet is protected by a key coded opening system.

The position of the AED will allow twenty four hour access to it, giving fast and easy accessibility to not only the users of the hall, but also to the emergency services and members of the general public whenever it is required.

#### Why the need for a CPAD

Sudden cardiac arrest claims around 150,000 to 200,000 lives each year in the UK, with survival rates being around 5% to 10% outside of a hospital setting. If a person's heart has stopped due to an accident or heart attack and is in a rhythm called ventricular fibrillation, the only way to get the heart into a more regular sustaining beat is to pass an electrical charge through the heart muscle. The first three to four minutes are the most vital for the collapsed person and if Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and a AED are available, then the chances of survival will increase considerably.

#### **How does a CPAD site work**

In the event of a person collapsing someone needs to dial 999 to call for an ambulance giving details of a suspected heart condition. The Ambulance service will direct the caller to where the nearest CPAD site is and will also give the caller the key code to enable them to open the cabinet. Each CPAD site covers an area of one mile radius to allow for fast retrieval of the AED and return to the casualty.

#### Do you need training in the use of a AED

The UK resuscitation council guidelines state there is no requirement to be trained in the use of an AED and that in the event of a person collapsing the non-trained person should still use the AED as step-by-step voice prompts that are part of the AED talks the user through the process of what to do.

#### Is there any risks in using an AED

If someone is having a cardiac arrest, using an AED, and undertaking CPR will improve the chances of survival. There have never been any reports of an AED harming a patient, user, or bystander. In addition, there have been no reports of an AED delivering any inappropriate shocks.

### Wolsey Grange 2 Planning Application DC/21/02671 Update

On 16<sup>th</sup> August Pinewood Parish Council submitted a document to Babergh District Council Planning Department which stated our concerns regarding the effect on the surrounding area of the 750 dwellings which are the subject of this application in addition to the 475 which are already under construction in Phase 1 of Wolsey Grange.

We asked that the Planning Department consider the effects of cumulative impact and heritage impact, the extra burden which will be placed on health infrastructure, education, ecology, water quality and on the local road network. We asked that a robust approach is taken on affordable housing and that greater regard is paid to sustainability. We supported objections raised by statutory agencies and public bodies.

#### A 14 Road Noise

The section of the A14 which borders our parish has a concrete surface of the type which was in use when the road was built. In conjunction with Belstead and Sproughton Parish Councils, Pinewood Parish Council has written to our MP, James Cartlidge and the Regional Manager of Highways England East, to raise awareness once again about noise levels generated by traffic on the A14 which affects residents in all our parishes. We pointed out that the section from the Orwell Bridge to Felixstowe has been resurfaced in recent years resulting in a much quieter road surface which produces less noise, both for road users and those whose homes and lives are affected by traffic noise.

In the past we have been told that resurfacing for safety reasons has priority over noise nuisance. However a consultation has begun on improvements to the Copdock Interchange. The aim is to improve journeys along the A12 and A 14 corridors as well as helping to boost economic growth and development opportunities within the Ipswich area, including the Port of Felixstowe. An inevitable consequence of this will be increasing levels of HGV and other traffic which will generate even more noise. In our letter to our MP and Highways England, we have therefore asked that if nothing can be done before any improvements begin, then consideration is given to removing the concrete surface of the A14 and replacing it with a quieter surface at the same time as the work at the interchange is undertaken.

The consultation on this scheme is in its early stages and unfortunately despite our best efforts, parish councils have not been included in discussions held so far. We hope that we will be included in the next stage and are able to speak for our parishes on this matter.

#### "Boy Racers" at it again in Pinewood

Once again we have a local issue with "Boy Racers" in Pinewood and our SCC representative Cllr Hudson has informed us of his intentions along with the PCC on the subject of getting it sorted. Note from SCC Cllr Christopher Hudson,

For too long Pinewood residents have suffered the serious inconvenience of "boy racers", with their anti-social behaviour, noise, disturbance of the peace and associated issues. To this end, the Police have been involved on several occasions to try and resolve the ongoing nightmare. The problem centres on Tesco car-park and then permeates Pinewood more generally, with consequential harassment.

The saga has had widespread media coverage, including most recently in the local Press. Indeed, I wrote in June to my colleague, Tim Passmore, to lobby hard for something effective to be done to cause "zero tolerance" of this serious nuisance. There were 5 ASB cases reported at the Copdock retail park in July. Here is an extract from the Police and Crime Commissioner's response to me in July......

"A joint operation involving the Safer Neighbourhood Teams and the Roads and Armed Policing Team (RAPT) remains in place, to proactively target those involved in vehicle related antisocial behaviour. This has resulted in the issue of Section 59 warnings, used in circumstances where vehicles are found to have been used in a manner which causes distress, alarm or annoyance, and Fixed Penalty Notices to drivers.

The Constabulary has also confirmed that the Safer Neighbourhood Team is also working with the management from Tesco to identify a long-term solution to prevent their car park being used."

This is positive news and I wanted to assure residents that I shall continue to monitor and pursue this serious matter until we have rid Pinewood of this nuisance.

#### **Electric Scooters**

There has been a noticeable increase in the use of electric scooters around the parish recently so it might be useful to highlight the law covering them.

#### **Did You Know**

It is against the law to ride a privately owned e-scooter on the public highway, pavement or footpaths!

Privately owned e-scooters can only be ridden on private land with the owner's permission.

E-scooters should only be used on main roads in areas designated as being part of the trial being carried out by the Department of Transport.

These scooters must be rental scooters and riders need to hold a full or provisional driving licence with a category "Q" entitlement.

They therefore should not be ridden by children.

E-scooters must have motor insurance and when rented from an approved rental company, insurance is provided by the e-scooter rental operator.

#### If you use an e-scooter illegally

- 1, You could face a fine.
- 2, You Could get penalty points on your licence.
  - 3, The e-scooter could be impounded.

The safety of our residents is important so we ask you politely that the law relating to e-scooters is followed in Pinewood Parish.

### What are the proposed main changes to the Highway Code

There are four main changes to the code for drivers to be aware of:

- 1.The introduction of a "hierarchy of road users" Pedestrians especially children, older and disabled adults are at the top of the hierarchy. In the Government's consultation, 79 percent of the 21,000 consulted support this concept.
- 2.Clarification on giving way to pedestrians crossing, or waiting to cross, the road.
- 3.Establishing safe passing speeds when overtaking cyclists and horse riders, and giving them priority when travelling straight ahead at junctions
- 4.Improving guidance for motorway driving, particularly if there is an incident or breakdown.


# Repairs to Footpath 6, from Wilson/Wilding Road to Bridge School (Update)





# **Local Policing Information**

### **Expect some of these new driving laws in 2021/22**

#### **MOT** extension ends

Driving without a valid MOT certificate could see road users fined up to £1,000 EU/Brexit driving changes

Although a last-minute agreement between the UK and the EU means British drivers will not need an International Driving Permit in most cases when travelling abroad, some documents are still needed. The biggest change is the need for a car insurance green card which is proof you have a valid policy in place, these can be obtained from a car insurance provider but road users must have a physical copy at all times. Drivers will also need to take their V5C logbook with them if their vehicle is less than 12-months-old. You must have a GB sticker on the car unless the number plate is GB stamped.

#### **Mobile phone use**

A loophole which allowed motorists to get away with taking photos or videos while driving has been closed, even if your stationary. Under the new rules, drivers can be issued a £200 fine and six penalty points.

#### **New ALKS lane-keeping tools**

Late last year, the Department for Transport announced the new "Automated Lane Keeping System" could be available on new UK cars from spring 2021. Depending on the results from a safety test, ALKS could be in all new cars soon.

#### **New Clean Air Zones**

London's expensive ULEZ (Ultra-low emission zone) system will be expanded to several Outer London boroughs from October adding an extra daily charge of £12.50 to millions of motorists. Bath and Birmingham will be the first cities outside of London to introduce new Clean Air Zone charges this year. Birmingham's scheme will charge this with the highest polluting vehicles up to £8 per day to use the roads.

#### **Green number plate changes**

Owners of electric and zero-emission vehicles can now buy the brand new green number plates. The scheme could launch a range of benefits for owners of fully-electric models with the Government hinting at cheaper parking and special zero-emission zones.

Future law changes

Brand new Intelligent Speed Assistant tools are set to become mandatory on all new cars from 2022. The new technology will alert drivers if they are going too fast and can intervene if a driver continues to drive above the limit.

Suffolk Police officers are using a smart location app to help them track down people in need. The location technology, known as What3Words, divides the world into 3m x 3m squares and allows users to share their exact location using a unique three word address.

The idea is that it is easier to communicate three words than it is to read out a grid reference, and that a position is more helpful than an address in many situations



### Over 1,900 motorists caught speeding as part of speed campaign

More than 1,900 motorists were caught speeding in Suffolk during a two week-long enforcement campaign. Officers spent the duration of the campaign highlighting and informing drivers of the risks of speeding and the consequences that driving above the limit can have through education and enforcement. During this year's campaign, held between Monday 26 July and Sunday 8 August, a total of 1,924 motorists were caught speeding,

#### Taking a rapid lateral flow test at home

If you did a rapid lateral flow test at home and the result was positive, you and anyone you live with must self-isolate immediately. Find out how long to self-isolate for: <a href="www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/self-isolaten-and-treatment/how-long-to-self-isolate/">www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/self-isolaten-and-treatment/how-long-to-self-isolate/</a> and report your rapid lateral flow test result as soon as possible to: <a href="www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result">www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result</a>. You should get a PCR test ordered at <a href="www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test">www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test</a> (a test that is sent to a lab) to confirm your result as soon as possible.

Continue to self-isolate until you get the result of the PCR test. Follow the advice you're given when you get the result. A negative result means that active coronavirus infection was not detected, at the time of the test. However, this does not guarantee that you do not have coronavirus. You should continue to follow coronavirus rules, including regular hand washing, social distancing and using face coverings where required.


